Annually, the California Youth Advocacy Network (CYAN) releases a report analyzing smoke and tobacco-free policies at colleges and universities in the state.

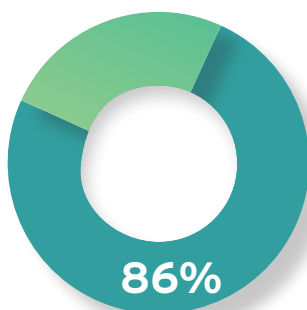
As of May 2023, 60% of public and private colleges and universities in California were 100% smoke or tobacco-free.

This Summary Report highlights findings from funded **Asian American, Native American, and Pacific Islander-serving** institutions of higher education in California.

Smoke/Tobacco-Free Policy Rationale

Why college and university policies go 100% smoke/tobacco-free:

- Decrease exposure to secondhand smoke and aerosol
- Decrease tobacco product use
- Eliminate tobacco product waste on campus
- Promote student success
- Eliminate exposure to new and emerging tobacco and nicotine products

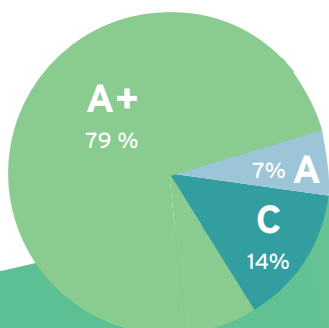
