

Rural Public College and University Summary

Annually, the California Youth Advocacy Network (CYAN) releases a report analyzing smoke and tobacco-free policies at colleges and universities in the state.

As of May 2023, 73% of California public college and university campuses are 100% smoke or tobacco-free. Of these campuses, all four-year institutions are smoke/tobacco-free compared to 66% of two-year institutions.

This Summary Report highlights smoke and tobacco-free policies at **public institutions** of higher education in California's **rural counties**.

Smoke/Tobacco-Free Policy Rationale

Why college and university policies go 100% smoke/tobacco-free:

- Decrease exposure to secondhand smoke and aerosol
- Decrease tobacco product use
- Eliminate tobacco product waste on campus
- Promote student success
- Eliminate exposure to new and emerging tobacco and nicotine products


